FROM THE MAYOR

Weekly video updates should help inform local community

During the COVID-19 pandemic I was asked to do a few videos to keep our residents up to date on what was going on, where to get needed help, and other information.

In Mesquite, it's difficult to get the latest news. We have no television coverage unless it's a disaster, and we have no daily newspaper.

We, at city hall, were approached by a company that could do video updates for us.

However, it was expensive, and we need to watch our budget carefully.

I offered to do them weekly at no cost to the city. We will do them in my office every Monday as often as possible starting, hopefully, June 26.

The videos will be on our city website as well as YouTube. I'm not sure yet if there will be other coverage. The videos will be non-political and strictly factual.

No fake news!

Recently I have been receiving e-mails about properties in disrepair and many that look like a junkyard. I know I wrote about this subject not long ago, but it's worth mentioning again.

I will probably upset a few people here in Mesquite, but please clean up your property if it's a mess.

Speaking on this subject, the old motel next to the beautiful new bank on Mesquite Boulevard will be coming down shortly.

A lot of legal work has to go into condemning someone's property.

As far as taking someone's property, eminent domain laws in Nevada are very restrictive and involve, a usually, long drawn-out legal process.

I have asked code enforcement to be out in the field as much as possible to check on properties that have been reported to the city as unsightly. So, I'll ask again, clean up your messes and keep Mesquite looking good.

Another topic that has come up lately is the riding of vehicles and or bicycles on sidewalks.

Let me quote from our city ordinance. "It is unlawful for any person to ride or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven, any motor vehicle or bicycle upon or along any sidewalk."

We have many people walking outside, especially early in the morning. A lot of our walking residents are older and may not hear or see you coming, so stay on the street please.

Of course, wear a helmet.

Speaking of safety, Colonial Property will be hosting a free, open to the public presentation on emergency preparedness, and slip, trip, and fall prevention.

It's July 12 at 1:30 p.m. at the Colonial Property board room. Location is 736 W. Pioneer Blvd. in the same complex as Wedgies and the Salvation Army.

Rotary comes through to help Salvation Army

They say that breakfast is the most important meal of the day.

But for those in need of food assistance in Mesquite, it can be the most scarce meal of the day.

Bill Ennis, director of the Salvation Army in Mesquite, recently reached out to some of the local organizations around town stating the need for breakfast foods for its pantry.

The noon Rotary Club came to its assistance, buying \$500 worth of breakfast foods from the local Smith's to help stock the shelves with cereal and other food items. The \$500 purchased 356 pounds of food.

"Breakfast foods are almost like a commodity," Ennis said. "We go through breakfast items really fast. Our shelves constantly need to be restocked."

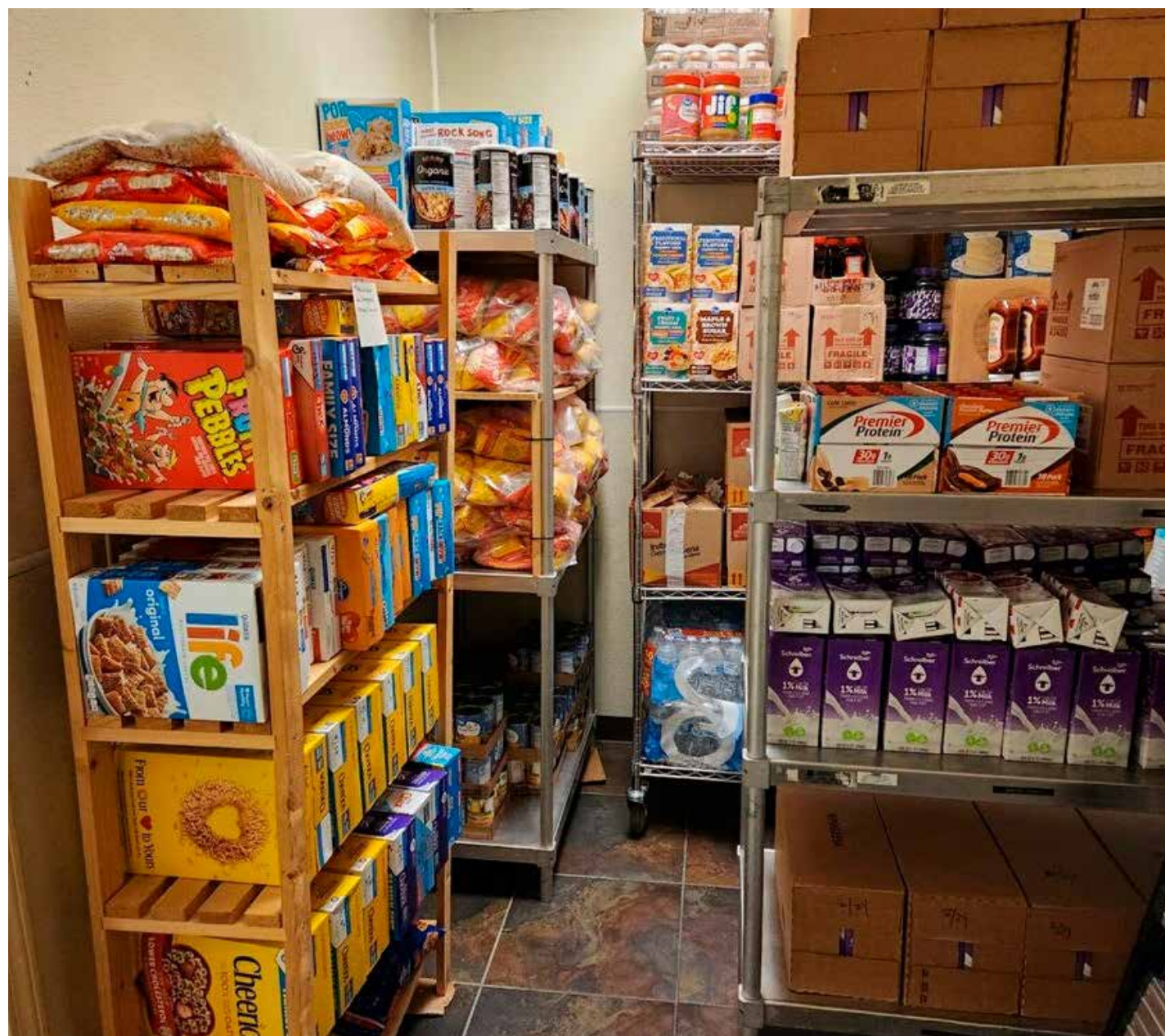
Rotarian Norman Utley heard about this need and went to his club to ask for help. He said the club, along with current president Jake Noll, didn't hesitate to approve the purchase. Utley said the club constantly goes through fund-raising campaigns so there is money in the account for such needs.

Utley went to the local Smith's with credit card in hand and made the purchase. He said the timing was good because the store had a sale on cereal and other breakfast foods, so the money went a long way.

"They're really in a tough spot right now," Utley said. "They're in a huge need."

Ennis said the Salvation Army has seen a big increase in those seeking food assistance in the past year. He said at this time last year, they were helping about 300 families a month. That number has gone up to more than 1,000 a month this year.

"With the way the economy is right now, people are really struggling," Ennis said. "For many, it's a case of keeping a roof over their

head or feeding the family. We try to help out as much as we can."

The Salvation Army gets regular food supplies, but sometimes it's not enough to supply all those in need in Mesquite. Fortunately, there are organizations like the Rotary and other local residents who always seem to help out.

Ennis said at this time, the preferred donation is actually food

items to help stock the pantry rather than just monetary donations (although anything helps). He said food donations at this time can go a lot further than just cash, since he's not able to get quite the discount on food that he has been able to get in the past.

"Right now, it's often less expensive for people to buy groceries and donate rather than just give money,"

Ennis said. "They can get it cheaper than I can."

Ennis said it's easy to donate non-perishable food or anything else to the Salvation Army. Just go make the purchase and drop it off at the office, located at 742 Pioneer Boulevard. Ennis said all donations are tax deductible.

Learn how to prevent wildfires in Nevada

85% of wildfires nationwide are caused by people.

You can lower this statistic. Help prevent wildfires.

CAMPFIRE SAFETY

Campfires that aren't properly maintained and extinguished can cause wildfires. Be responsible for your campfire.

- Never leave your campfire unattended.
- Always keep a shovel and bucket nearby.
- When extinguishing your campfire, use the drown, stir, feel method: drown the fire with water and stir around the fire area with your shovel to wet any remaining embers and ash. Shovel dirt onto the campfire site and mix and smother thor-

oughly. Feel the area with the back of your hand to make sure all the heat is out. Repeat this process until you are sure there is no more heat left in your campfire.

EQUIPMENT SAFETY

Lawn mowers, weed eaters, chain saws, grinders, welders, tractors, and trimmers can all spark a wildland fire. Do your part, the right way, to keep your community fire safe.

Mow before 10 a.m., but never when it's windy or excessively dry.

Keep the exhaust system, spark arresters and mower in proper working order and free of carbon buildup.

Use the recommended grade of fuel and don't top it off.

Don't drive your vehicle onto

dry grass or brush.

VEHICLE AND TOWING SAFETY

Motorists are responsible for many of the wildfires sparked along the roadways. Nearly all of these fires could be prevented by following these safety rules.

Secure safety chains on all towing equipment.

Use appropriate safety pins and hitchball to secure chains.

Ensure your vehicle is properly maintained:

Proper tire pressure can prevent a blowout, exposed wheel rims will throw sparks.

Properly maintain brakes, brakes worn too thin can cause metal to metal contact which can cause sparks.

Get regular tune ups to prevent a clogged exhaust system

which can launch hot particles into vegetation.

Avoid parking or driving in dry grass and brush. Hot exhaust pipes and mufflers can start a fire.

TARGET SHOOTING SAFETY

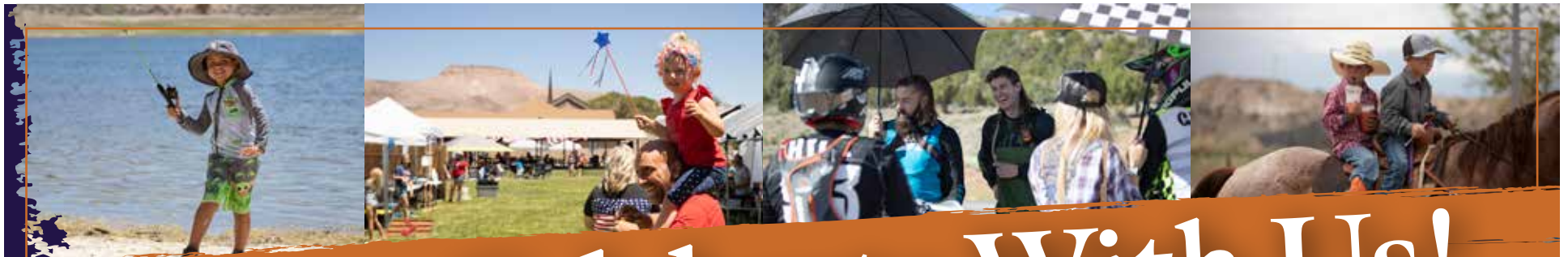
Careless shooting can cause fires. If it's dry, hot and windy; save your ammo.

Avoid shooting into rocks or metal objects and place targets in areas that are free of vegetation.

Always have water, a shovel and a fire extinguisher ready in case a fire starts.

Clean up all your targets and shells when you're finished shooting and pack them out.

Exploding targets, incendiary rounds and tracer ammunition are illegal on all public lands
